**Approval of Minutes: Council September 13, 2021**

Carol Donaldson, 2 Pelton Drive, thanked Mr. Peebles and anyone else that is responsible for the work that is being done on Pelton Drive.

Beth Thomas, Program Director for Fulton County Healthy Choices Caring Communities, submitted a power point document to council and audience discussing the long-term effects of marijuana use and the impact it has on the community. She quickly went through the document and asked council if they would consider passing an ordinance concerning a moratorium for the dispensaries.

**Old Business:**

**Ordinance #21-12:** Eliminating parking on Main Street

A motion was made by Frank, seconded by Todd to eliminate parking on Main Street between Wood Street and Madison Street on its 2nd reading. Dawson – No, Frank – Yea, Thomas – Yea, Todd – Yea. Motion carried.

**New Business:**

**Resolution #21-16:** The establishment of Fund 420

A motion was made by Frank, seconded by Todd to establish a new fund (Grant Construction Fund) consistent with the requirements of O.R.C. 5705.09(f) on its 1<sup>st</sup> reading. All votes yea, motion carried.

**Resolution #21-17:** Declaring it necessary to levy a tax

A motion was made by Dawson, seconded by Todd to declare it necessary to levy a tax in excess of the ten (10) mill limitation on its 1<sup>st</sup> reading. All votes yea, motion carried.

**Resolution #21-18:** Authorize execution of agreements with Certified Oil Company

A motion was made by Frank, seconded by Todd to authorize the Village Administrator to execute agreements with Certified Oil Company for the purchase of property located at 200 Main Street on its 1<sup>st</sup> reading. Thomas – Yea, Todd – Yea, Dawson – No, Frank – Yea. Motion carried.

Councilman Dawson stated he has a problem with spending the money when there are other expenses that need to be purchased.
